What's The Big Read?

The Big Read is an initiative of the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) and Arts Midwest. Pennington Library has been awarded a matching grant for a community reading program designed around a single book. Funding will support the purchase of books and help pay for expenses for activities such as panel discussions, lectures, film screenings, art exhibitions, theatrical and musical performances, poetry slams, writing workshops and storytelling events. We are responsible for providing a kick-off event and arranging a partnership with at least one community organization to expand our base of ages, abilities, cultural backgrounds, education levels and occupations.

Pennington Library was selected as one of 62 non-profits nationwide to receive The Big Read grant for 2024. It is our third Big Read. Our previous selections were *True Grit* by Charles Portis in 2019 and The Best We Could Do by Thi Bui in 2022.

For 2024 we have chosen Circe by Madeline Miller. Activities for The Big Read extend from February 24th to April 14th. The Library has purchased 220 copies of Circe for free distribution. So far our schedule includes a book discussion featuring Madeline Miller's other books, The Song of Achilles and Galatea: A Short Story and a virtual Keynote conversation with the author. Other activities include a Foraging Walk, A Self Defense program, a Greek inspired art workshop and a Guided Autobiography Workshop. Many more programs will follow as we engage others in the community.

The generous donation of time and space by community volunteers is an important way to meet our matching grant of \$10,000. We hope you will want to join our creative activities and programs to help us bring to life the origin story of a mythological goddess, and so much more. Mark your calendars now!

What's New? From the Director's Desk

As Library Director, I often feel moved by interactions with our warm and receptive community. This past year, in collaboration with other non-profits, we hosted two sold-out crowds at the Hopewell Theater: a screening of the documentary film "A Fine Line" and an art talk about Frida Kahlo.

This year we changed to a Fine Free system for books and other materials that are returned late, providing a more welcoming Library. The Coffee Station has returned and the Eleanor Fisher memorial tall clock is once again chiming for our visitors.

If you visit you will see "Shelf Talkers" posted to tell about our books and authors. By enrolling in our Showcase Program you will receive monthly emails announcing new Library titles. In June we joined the Library Speaker's Consortium which provides access to bestselling author interviews at LibraryC.org/PenningtonLibrary. A visit to YouTube.com/PenningtonPublicLibrary will list a wide range of our past programs.

Kunkel Park is the location of our first Story Walk, where children can follow an illustrated children's book. The Friends maintain The Little Free Library at Kunkel Park. Built in memory of Kathleen McIlvaine, a kind neighbor, it is filled with books for children and young adults. Enjoy looking for the original house on King George Road that served as the model!

None of these programs and resources would be available without vou. Through your donations to the Friends of Pennington Library, we receive financial support and encouragement to experiment with the many ways to enjoy a library. The Volunteers provide friendly and helpful assistance to the staff and our patrons. Every time you join an online program or borrow a book, you are helping us to understand what the Library means to you and how we can serve you in the best possible way.

Please join us for The Big Read. We have many copies of *Circe* to share. Through our many activities, The Big Read will bring us together in an exciting voyage from Ancient Greece to 30 North Main Street!

Busy children enjoy being a fireman at Busy Town

Busy Town

On a beautiful day in April the Friends of Pennington Library returned to our pre-Covid days by hosting students from Toll Gate Kindergarten, Pennington Presbyterian Nursery School and St. Matthew's Pre-School for the 9th annual Busy Town, based on the wonderful book *Busy, Busy Town* by Richard Scarry.

Mayor Davy welcomed 112 students and their teachers, parents and siblings to the Municipal Parking Lot to introduce children to Community Heroes and Helpers. Pennington policemen showed the children the specialized equipment they use as first responders. Pennington firemen allowed children to put on heavy hats, coats and boots as they learned about the shiny knobs and levers on the fire truck. They were allowed to hold a hose, spraying water just like a fireman putting out a fire! The Department of Public Works displayed a backhoe and "Stinky" the garbage truck. Dr. Suzuki and Pixie Salon explained their professions. Emily's Café served lemonade to our thirsty guests and Pennington Dance Studio provided a way to get the wiggles out!

Some of our guests had never been in our Library, so our librarians read them a story and showed them the world of books. Each child went home with a book provided by the Friends and plenty of stories to share with their parents when they were picked up from school.
